Catholic Teaching and Sacramental Preparation in St Mary's, St John Bosco, and St Edward's:

To all parents.

When your child was baptised, as you will remember, you promised to bring up your child in the Catholic faith. Sometimes this can be difficult, so we are trying to support you in this role by offering teaching programmes for your child from the age of 5 until they reach Confirmation age at 12 or 13 years of age. Leaflets and application forms are in all three church porches for you to explore what is available. Children can join the Children's Liturgy group at any time; 1st Holy Communion for those in Year 4 and above will be beginning on Tuesday 24th September in Holy Cross School, starting at 3.20pm, or on Thursday 26th September in St John Bosco hall, starting at 6pm. The Post Holy Communion programme will be beginning on Tuesday 24th September in St Mary's hall, starting at 6pm; The Intermediate course will begin in February 2025; These three programmes run every year. The pre-Confirmation and the Confirmation courses will run on alternate years. This year the pre-Confirmation course will commence in October for 15 sessions, and the next Confirmation course will commence in October 2025. In order to join the Confirmation course next year, you must attend the pre-Confirmation course this year as it is designed to lead into the Confirmation course. A reflection from Pope Francis for the Year of Prayer, for the Twenty-Second Sunday of the Year: Consider the importance of the Sacred Scriptures in the life of prayer, a dialogue between God and ourselves. The interplay of prayer and the reading of Scripture is seen especially in the practice of lectio divina. This consists of slowly reading a biblical passage, then spending a period of time meditating on the text in openness to the Holy Spirit, letting God speak to us through a particular word, phrase or image. The fruit of this prayerful dialogue is contemplation, as we silently rest under the Father's loving gaze. The Scriptures thus become an inexhaustible source of peace, wisdom and strength as we grow in faith and give it concrete expression in charity and service of others.
