## **Teaching**

#### **Questions 128-129 of the Penny Catechism**

128. What is the eleventh article of the Creed?

The eleventh article of the Creed is, 'the resurrection of the body'.

129. What do you mean by 'the resurrection of the body'?

By 'the resurrection of the body' I mean that we shall rise again with the same bodies at the day of judgment'.

<u>Holy Baptism:</u> We encourage our parish families to present their newborn infants for the Sacrament of Baptism soon after birth, because this sacrament is the foundation of the Christian life. In Baptism, the child, freed from original sin, becomes an heir to the Kingdom of God, receiving the theological virtues of faith, hope, and charity, and the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. Arrangements for infant baptism must be made in advance by contacting Fr. John.

Encountering Christ in His Church/RCIA: This course is for any non-Catholic young people and adults, especially non-baptised, who would like to know more about the Catholic Faith and ask questions about it or for those who are considering joining the Catholic Church. Thursdays 6:30pm at St. Mary's.

**Confession:** To receive the sacrament of reconciliation worthily we must: examine our conscience, be sorry for our sins, have the firm purpose of not sinning again, confess our sins to the Priest, and be willing to do the penance the Priest gives us. This sacrament, worthily received, always takes away all eternal punishment.

<u>Holy Communion:</u> To receive Holy Communion worthily it is necessary to be free from mortal sin, to have a right intention, and to obey the Church's one hour fast required before Holy Communion out of reverence for the body and blood of our Divine Lord.

<u>Confirmation</u>: To receive Confirmation properly it is necessary to be in the state of grace, and to know well the chief truths and duties of our religion. After we have been confirmed, we should continue to study our religion even more earnestly than before, so that we may be able to explain and defend our faith, and thus co-operate with the grace of Confirmation.

Adoration: "Know also that you will probably gain more by praying fifteen minutes before the Blessed Sacrament than by all the other spiritual exercises of the day. True, Our Lord hears our prayers anywhere, for He has made the promise, 'Ask, and you shall receive,' but He has revealed to His servants that those who visit Him in the Blessed Sacrament will obtain a more abundant measure of grace." – St. Alphonsus Liguori

Anointing of the Sick: This is the sacrament which, through the anointing with blessed oil by the Priest, and through his prayer, gives health and strength to the soul and sometimes to the body when we are in danger of death from sickness, accident, or old age. There will be a healing Mass with Anointing on Tuesday the 11<sup>th</sup> of February at 7pm at St. Mary's.

**Liturgy:** The sacred liturgy is the true worship of God, enacted by Jesus Christ and His body, the Church, through the power of the Holy Spirit. It is a shared public work with ceremonies, rites and formulas established by scripture and tradition.

The first celebrant of the liturgy is Christ Himself. As High Priest he celebrates the heavenly liturgy ceaselessly in the presence of the holy Mother of God, the apostles, the saints and all those who are already in the Kingdom. The Church has liturgy in obedience to God. The sacramental rites of the New Testament fulfil and replace the Old Testament rituals. This change is most clearly expressed by Christ's command at Passover, "do this in memory of me."

As the true worship of God, it is also clear that the liturgy of the Church should follow the ceremonies, rites and formulas established by scripture and tradition where the will of God is revealed.

As we are physical and social beings, it is fitting that the liturgy that God has given to us be public and engage all our senses. Liturgy therefore involves common prayers, visual signs, symbolic actions, incense, sacred music and the proclamation of scripture.

**Evening Prayer:** During Lent the Evening Prayer of the Church with sermon will be celebrated on Sundays at 6pm.
