Finances at St. Mary's, St. John Bosco and St. Edward's

At St. Mary's and St. John Bosco we are now behind having one year's expenditure in our accounts by £5,124.03. This has worsened due to the new monthly diocesan quota amount of £1,044.71 for St. Mary's and St. John Bosco. We need to have at least one year's expenditure, around £70,000, to cater for any emergencies that may occur especially as we have 6 buildings: two houses, two halls and two Churches, to look after. St. Edward's new monthly diocesan quota is £456.31.
