#### Catechesis of the Week

"If God is good, why is there evil and sin in the world?"

The Catholic Church teaches that God did not create evil. He created us free, because love cannot be forced. Sin entered the world when our first parents misused that freedom (Genesis 3). The Fall wounded human nature, but did not destroy it. CCC 386: "Sin is present in human history; any attempt to ignore it or to give this dark reality other names would be futile."

So where is the Good News? God did not abandon us. From the very moment of the Fall, He promised a Saviour (Gen 3:15). Evil is real, but Christ has conquered it by His Cross and Resurrection. Our part is to turn away from sin and receive God's mercy in the sacraments, especially Reconciliation. The problem is not that God is absent, but that He loves us enough to let us choose — and merciful enough to save us when we fall, if we'll let Him.

### **Thinking About a Sacrament?**

Many people reach a moment when they feel drawn to one of the Church's sacraments:

- Parents seeking Baptism for their child
- Children longing for their First Holy Communion
- Young people desiring the graces of Confirmation
- Couples hoping to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage
- Adults thinking of returning to Confession or even being received into the Catholic Church

If this is you, or someone in your family, the first step is very simple: speak to Fr. John. The sacraments are not just ceremonies or milestones — they are real encounters with Jesus Christ, where He gives us His grace, forgives our sins, strengthens our faith, and draws us deeper into His life. They are treasures of the Church, given to help us on the journey to heaven.

- How it works:
- A conversation with Fr. John begins the process.
- Together we discern what is needed: sometimes that means preparation sessions, sometimes it means simply being ready.
- Preparation is personal one-to-one or as a family, so it fits where you are in faith and life.

#### A word about readiness:

The sacraments are celebrations of faith. For example, First Holy Communion or Confirmation cannot be received apart from a life of faith that is lived — especially by being present at Sunday Mass. If you or your child are not yet there, don't worry — you are still very welcome to come and talk. We will walk with you, answer questions, and help you grow in faith at your own pace. This means:

If you are ready, we will prepare you for the sacrament itself.

If you are not yet ready, we will help you begin the journey of faith — through simple steps like prayer, conversations, and coming to Mass.

Either way, the door is always open.
