Christmas, the Incarnation, and the New Year

Christmas is not a seasonal feeling. It is a doctrine.

At Christmas the Church proclaims something astonishing and concrete: God has taken flesh. The eternal Son of the Father has entered human history, not as an idea or symbol, but as a real man, born of the Virgin Mary, to save us from sin and death.

“The Word became flesh and dwelt among us.”

That sentence is the heart of the Christian faith. If it is true, then nothing about human life is insignificant. Our bodies matter. Our choices matter. Our salvation matters.

This is why the Church does not give us one day of Christmas, but an Octave. For eight days she insists that we stay with the mystery, because the Incarnation cannot be rushed. God has united Himself permanently to our humanity, so that we might be united to Him by grace.

The feasts that follow Christmas unfold what this really means.

St Stephen shows us that Christ is worth dying for.

St John reminds us that the faith is grounded in truth, not opinion.

The Holy Family teaches us that holiness is learned through obedience, sacrifice, and daily fidelity.

And on 1 January, Mary, the Holy Mother of God, stands at the beginning of the year, reminding us that salvation came into the world through her humble “yes.”

As one year ends and another begins, the Church does not ask us to make resolutions first. She asks us to remain in Christ. To return to the sacraments. To live in the state of grace. To allow the Incarnate Word to shape our minds, our morals, and our homes.

Christmas tells us that God has not come to affirm us as we are, but to redeem us. The Child in the manger is the Lamb who will take away the sins of the world. The wood of the crib already points toward the wood of the Cross. And yet this is a message of hope, not fear. Because God has entered time, time itself is redeemed. Because Christ

has taken our flesh, our lives can be healed from within. Because the Son has been born of Mary, we can become sons and daughters of the Father.

As we enter the new year, we do so not alone, and not uncertain of God's intentions. We begin it under the blessing of the Church, with the Holy Name of Jesus on our lips and the Mother of God praying for us.

Christmas has changed the world.
It can change us too — if we allow it.

So let us keep the feast faithfully. Let us live as Catholics who believe what the Church teaches. And let us step into the year ahead with confidence, knowing that God is with us, God has saved us, and God will not abandon us. Merry Christmas to you all, Fr. John
